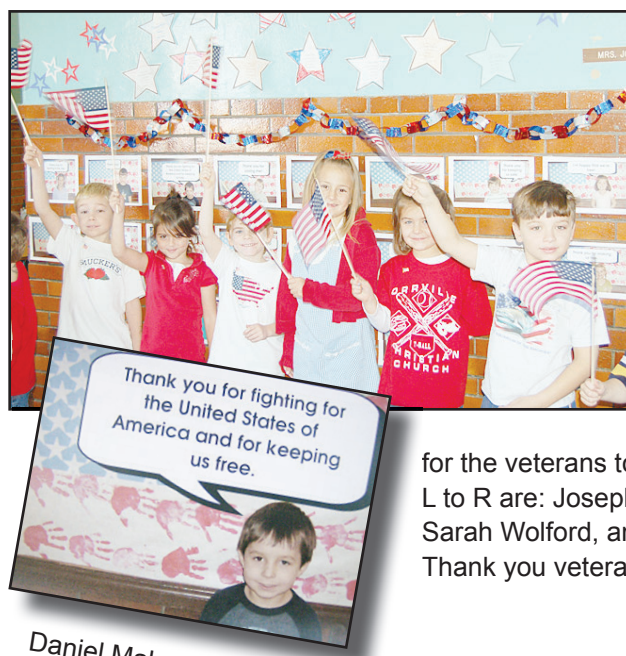


I am Patriotic
